DECEMBER 7th 2020

79th anniversary bombing of Pearl Harbor remembered.

It started in 1998 when a Park was renamed in honor of Loveland’s first KIA of WWII at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on Dec 7th 1941. Harold Dwayne Webster is one of the 1,731 fatal casualties that did not survive aboard the USS Arizona BB-39 on December 7th 1941. A day that will live in infamy. Thanks to the efforts of Treva Edwards (past Loveland Mayor), William “Bill” Dewey (USN RET), and William A. Shlingman (USN) the South Lake Loveland Park was renamed. Often referred to as “Cannon Park” by the local kids, the park was renamed to honor the Veterans in Loveland in 1998. The dedication included a flagpole, and bronze plaque on a vertically mounted stone of Sn2 Harold Dwayne Webster. Organizer Bill Dewey continued to ensure this solemn ceremony would continue until his sudden passing in 2004. Since then, Tony DuMosch had taken the helm to ensure this remembrance will continue for years to come.

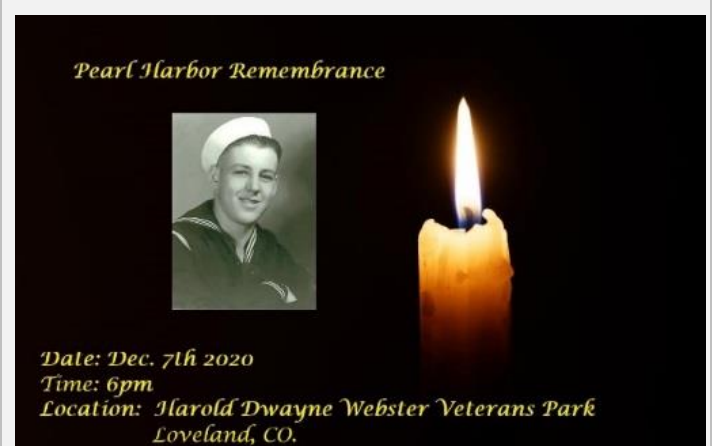
Soon after the renaming and dedication of the veterans’ park, the first flag to be flown on Dec 7th 1998 had also flown over the USS Arizona on November 11th 1998. That very same flag had flown once again on 20 years later on December 7th 2018 with the help of the local cub scouts.

Some facts you may not know about Dec. 7th 1941:

1. There were 22 sets of brothers who perished aboard the USS Arizona
2. It was the only time in history an entire Navy Band Unit perished on a single day (22 sailors).
3. There are only two living survivors left from the USS Arizona BB39.

Once known as the U.S. Army Air Service, it had later become known as the U.S. Army Air Corps from July 2nd 1926 thru March 9th 1942. The U.S. Army Air Force came to be on June 20th 1941 with their motto "Above The Rest". The US Army Air Corps was disbanded on September 18th 1947 and made way for the U.S. Air Force. The U.S. Air Force motto is "Aim High". The U.S. Air Force Space Command was created on September 1st 1982 until December 20th 2019, when the United States Space Force was officially identified as its own uniformed military service branch. U.S. Space Force motto is: "Semper Supra" (Always Above). With slightly over 2,500 personnel and over 75 spacecraft they operate, we say Happy 1st Birthday to the United States Space Force. Currently there are over 6,000 satellites that orbit the Earth, but only about 40% of them are operational.
